

Standing Rules

For Wild West Dogsport (WWDS) Club Members

The following standing rules have been established for all active members of Wild West Dogsport. Each active member must observe all the rules shown below and supply a signed acknowledgement of this document (see page 5 & 6) to be kept on file with the acting club secretary.

Goals & Club Philosophy

WWDS aims to be a competitive Schutzhund dog-training club that produces impressive dog-handler teams, exhibited with exemplary sportsmanship and proudly supported by other members during event participation in all three phases. WWDS is open to all working breeds of dogs that show an aptitude for the rigors of the sport. While not all handlers or dogs may be capable of equal accomplishments, it is still expected that members strive to not only train their dogs but also title them to the best of their abilities.

WWDS is a unique dog-training club, in that its member's success, progress, and the longevity of the club are only possible if certain core prerequisites are met at all times. When setting rules for the club, these core requisites are our guiding essentials, against which all circumstances are evaluated. As you read the following rules, recognize that each rule was specifically created to ensure the preservation of these core requisites above all other considerations:

Requisite 1: We must ensure that our helper Joel Monroe continues to enjoy training with our club, and is properly compensated at all times. Joel provides training that is so far above standard, that replacing him is simply impossible. Without Joel, our club ceases to exist.

Requisite 2: We must ensure that none of our actions harm our relationship with Columbine School and thus our opportunity for continued use of these first-rate training grounds. Without the use of the school, our club ceases to exist.

Requisite 3: We must ensure that those accepted as active members continue to make a well-matched group that is indisputably loyal, supportive and engaged with the club, both financially as well as personally. Without loyal active members, our club ceases to exist.

The following rules, aim to prioritize these core elements at all times.

1) General Conduct

- a) Members of WWDS are generally expected to protect the image and reputation of the sport of Schutzhund, of DVG, WWDS, its members, helpers and dogs. Public comments about any of the above should be strictly routed through the board of directors. The privilege of membership in WWDS includes the expectation for each member to portray the club, its members, helpers and activities in a respectful, positive way and offer kind encouragement to those who consider joining. Members are expected and encouraged to not only provide helpful comments to new and prospective members, but also defer them to the training director or club officers.
- b) Conduct of members during Training-Saturdays (TS) should be conducive to continued learning, improvement and under-

standing of the sport of Schutzhund in general and specifically the training sequencing for each fellow member's dog, as well as the member's own dog. Members are expected to participate in training sessions of other members by aiding them and the training helper wherever possible and by observing and asking questions about the training process. The use of profanity is not appropriate in this setting.

- c) Members must take responsibility for their training progress in all phases of the sport by seeking knowledge independently as well as during TS, from sources such as books, videos, websites and/or private trainers. Each dog's progress varies, but it is generally understood that independent practice times are necessary in order to improve and achieve training milestones & titles.

2) Photos & Video Recordings

Photos and video may be recorded for personal use only. Neither may be published publically, online or emailed without the express permission of every person, helper, handler and dog featured. Infractions of this rule will result in disciplinary action and may be cause for dismissal from the club.

3) Potential New Members & New Dogs

- a) Members are encouraged to promote WWDS to potential new members and invite them to come observe the Saturday training sessions. However, WWDS has a screening protocol in place that assures inviting and evaluating only those persons (and dogs) that have been fully informed about the club requirements, fees, goals and the commitment level necessary for the sport. In addition, this will ensure that potential new members know what to bring out with them to the training field and what will be required of them in order to get their dog evaluated. To this end, each potential new member should be referred to the club vice-president before his/her first visit to the club.
- b) Active members who wish to add another dog to regular training must first have the dog evaluated and approved by the training helper. The maximum number of dogs allowed in active training may vary, but is generally considered approximately 20 dogs. In the event of reaching close to the maximum, the board of directors will determine which new dogs – if any – to allow into the active training group.

4) How to Join – Provisional Status to Active Membership

The following paragraphs outline the steps required to become an Active Member of WWDS:

- a) Apply for provisional status:
 - i) Provisional status is open to persons who wish to be accepted into the club as active members and lasts a period of 6 months, unless the board convenes a special meeting of the membership to discuss the applicant's progress.
 - ii) Provisional status can commence if the following prerequisites have been met:

- (1) WWDS must have available training slot(s) for new active members;
 - (2) The applicant must have submitted a membership application;
 - (3) The applicant must have provided a signed copy of the standing rules and supply all necessary information;
 - (4) The applicant must have received a satisfactory evaluation of his/her dog/s by the training director
 - (5) The applicant must have supplied the club initiation fee as specified in the "Fees" section.
- b) During the provisional term, WWDS members have a chance to evaluate the applicant and his/her dog, the applicant's training approach, as well as his/her commitment and passion for the good of the club and the sport of Schutzhund. Equally, the applicant has the opportunity to participate in club training and activities as if s/he was a full member, thus providing opportunity for his/her evaluation of WWDS. During the provisional period the applicant must:
- i) attend and partake in full-length club activities (training, trials, etc.) & bring forth an effort to observe and learn
 - ii) pay applicable active member training fees, assessment fees and any fines incurred
 - iii) participate in setup and cleanup duties (even when not their turn to do so) and lunch/supply errands
 - iv) participate in and offer to help with other member's training when appropriate
 - v) demonstrate a desire to support the nature, objective and purposes of WWDS and DVG
- c) At the conclusion of the provisional term, the applicant has the opportunity to become a full active member, where:
- i) A club meeting will be convened, to review positive & negative areas of the applicant's performance during his/her provisional term and to bring the applicant's membership status to a vote. Applicant may not be present at this meeting.
 - ii) If the applicant receives a majority vote from the active membership, s/he is then an active member of WWDS.
 - iii) If the applicant does not receive a majority vote, s/he will be given a refund of the club initiation fee only.

5) How to Join – Inactive Membership

Persons wishing to become inactive members must submit an application, a one-time \$50 administrative fee and yearly WWDS/DVG dues. Inactive members who want to sporadically participate in TS's must pay the same fees as drop-ins, as outlined in the "Fees" section.

6) How to Join – Inactive Members Converting to Active Membership

In-active members wishing to become Active members must follow all steps outlined in section 4 above.

7) How to Join – Former Active WWDS Members

Former active members of WWDS, who chose to leave active membership at any time for any reason, must follow all steps outlined in section 4 above. In addition, however, such applicant will be required to pay the "penalty initiation fee" as set forth in the "Fees" section. This initiation fee contains a loyalty-penalty required regardless of circumstance.

8) Helpers/Decoys

Helpers have special privileges as determined by the board of directors that may extend to fees, renewals and training order.

9) Training-Saturdays

Active members participate in Training-Saturdays (TS) in an effort to advance their and their dog's expertise in the sport of Schutzhund. Each TS consists of one open-field obedience session (no instruction) and two protection-training run-throughs. Open field obedience begins at approximately 10 am and protection begins at approximately 11:30 am. There typically is a lunch break during mid-day, and most TS run through to the late afternoon hours.

10) Groups & Drop-Ins

- a) Each active and provisional member becomes part of a group consisting of roughly 2 to 6 members, for the purpose of fair rotation of setup and cleanup duties.
- b) Groups and training order line-up are determined by the Sergeant at Arms, who publishes them monthly via email and on a whiteboard at the field. Members are expected to stay informed as to when it is their turn and have their dog ready with the necessary equipment and on deck by the time the prior dog is finishing up its turn. Changes to the line-up must be approved and posted by the Sergeant at Arms.
- c) Setup/cleanup duties rotate groups each TS. The group on setup/cleanup is expected to arrive no later than 9:45 am and have the field ready for training by 10 am, as well as stay until the last dog has been worked to finish cleanup duties. The specific duties are found elsewhere in this document.
- d) Members must notify their group if unable to attend on their setup/cleanup TS and/or contact others to switch their turn.
- e) Drop-ins for training will be worked after all active members have had their first protection session.

11) Training Field & Adjacent Grounds

- a) WWDS considers it an immense privilege to be able to use Columbine School for training. All WWDS members are expected to treat the grounds, buildings & surrounding areas with utmost respect, consideration and cleanliness. All trash/dog waste must be removed from the grounds, even if you didn't leave it personally. Remember that schoolchildren are in attendance on the grounds during school days.
- b) The area at the very NW of the school grounds has been designated as the dog potty area. As such, members may walk their dogs here, but must always remove any waste left behind. Members may also walk their dogs in the vineyards adjacent to the school grounds.
- c) The actual training field is the grass area south of the playground and continuing all the way to the south side fence, and between the utility shed and the basketball court. The perimeter of the field is the "on-deck" area, such as the dirt area to the west, the basketball court at the east, the grass and playground area to the north and the walkways around the south side of the building.

12) Smoking, Drinking, Drugs

- a) WWDS has a "Zero-Tolerance" policy for smoking, drinking or the use of drugs on any portion of the school grounds, since such usage may cause the club's immediate dismissal from the school and thus will not be permitted anywhere on the school grounds, including the parking lot.
- b) Cigarette butts may not be left on the grounds or in the parking lot.
- c) Anyone found to be under the influence of or impaired by any legal or illegal substance, including prescription drugs, may be expelled from training for the day or face other

consequences as severe as club expulsion, as determined by the board of directors and training director.

13) Parking & Dog Confinement

- a) Regular parking is not restricted and members may park where it is safe and practical to do so.
- b) Members bringing bitches in season should be sensitive to parking too close to other members with male dogs and are encouraged to check with others to ascertain if their dog would be bothered by the bitch in season parked in the car next to them.
- c) Members are expected to provide safe confinement for their dogs while waiting their turn, such as sturdy plastic or wire crates, dog trailers, etc. Crates may be moved to shade areas on the school grounds away from the training area for added cooling and ventilation. Dogs confined in motorhomes or similar vehicles must be further confined in either an interior space or crate, so that they are unable to accidentally slip out of or break open the vehicle's doors.

14) Obedience & Training Etiquette

- a) All dogs must be securely kept in wire or plastic crates when not being worked or exercised. Members are expressly responsible for their dog's well-being & safety and must make sure there is adequate ventilation, shade, shelter and water available to their dog/s at all times.
- b) Dogs must be kept under strict control whenever out of their crates and must be kept on leash at all times (except during off-leash heeling) on the field, on deck, in the parking lot and around the school buildings.
- c) Dogs not yet fully off-leash trained should always wear a line and/or remote collar, to avoid any incidents with other dogs, people and/or to prevent injury to the dog if it runs across the adjacent roadway or parking lot.
- d) Members with dog aggressive or people aggressive dogs must always keep the safety of others and their dogs as their highest priority. Members with such dogs are expected to keep their dogs controlled, prevent them from initiating any attack and advising others of these facts. They are furthermore expected to seek out solutions to the problem with the help of the training director, training helper or independently. Members may not use the presence of other dog/handler teams as training opportunities without the other member's express consent. Any such incident may result in fines and/or restricted training access.
- e) It is generally frowned upon to allow your dog to engage in staring at or barking at other member's dogs while on the training grounds.
- f) Members are encouraged to help each other in obedience training by offering to be 'the group' or 'the judge', provide distractions, shoot the gun or spot the member.
- g) Members must respect each other on the field and continue to check each other's position and whereabouts to avoid interfering in an exercise or unduly distracting a dog not yet ready for such distractions.
- h) Members wishing to practice the gunshots must first check with all other members on the field with their dogs, to be sure everyone is ready or has time to reposition themselves and their dog relative to the gun.
- i) Members wishing to practice the go-out must ask other members on the field to briefly move away from the send-out area so as to practice the exercise in the safest way possible.

- j) Members using the wall, jump or centerline of field may not do so for an excessive amount of time, as others may be waiting for a turn.
- k) Members wishing to play with their dogs after obedience training should do so on the field inside the school's running track or elsewhere deemed safe. Holding up other members from using the training field while exercising or playing with your dog is not acceptable.
- l) Members may take their dogs to the field inside the school's running track during obedience or protection training, as long as their activities do not disturb the training in progress. It is the handler's responsibility to conservatively assess his/her dog's reliability in this situation, and abstain from off-leash activities, if there is a chance that the dog may break and run towards the training area.
- m) In the one (1) month period before a trial, use of the obedience field & equipment is prioritized to those dog-handler teams officially entered in the trial (fees & application submitted).

15) Equipment

- a) Members are responsible for obtaining the necessary equipment to maximize their dog's training in all three phases of the sport. The Training Director can provide suggestions for what equipment is needed & where it can be purchased.
- b) Members must maintain their equipment to highest standards, keeping in mind first & foremost the safety of the training decoy, other members and their dogs and their own.
- c) Members are further required to give great care to equipment belonging to the club (i.e. jumps, blinds, etc.), the training decoy (i.e. sleeves, long lines), or other members.
- d) Helper equipment, such as sleeves, sticks, whips, etc. may not be picked up, tried out or used except with the permission and under the supervision of a helper or club officer.
- e) Members must limit any thrashing of the sleeve by their dog, by immediately going to the dog to stop the behavior.

16) Ice Chest

The club's ice chest is provided for our helpers' comfort and care. Each member is permitted one free beverage per TS. Additional beverages can be purchased for \$1 each, payable to the Sergeant at Arms or Treasurer. Members may bring their own beverages and keep them in the club ice chest during the training day, as long as such use does not adversely affect the storage of an adequate amount of beverages for the helper's use.

17) Fees

a) Initiation Fees & Yearly Club Dues

- i) The initiation fee for persons joining the club as active members is \$300.
- ii) The one-time administrative fee for persons joining as inactive members is \$50.
- iii) The initiation fee for former active members wishing to re-join active membership is \$500. This fee contains a loyalty penalty assessed regardless of circumstance.
- iv) The yearly club dues are based on a budget review by the board of directors in July of each year and may be influenced by fluctuations in number of members, costs of judge's airfares, accommodations, equipment, DVG membership fees, etc. The renewal fee for 2010 was \$135 per member. Yearly dues are not expected to exceed \$200 and include DVG membership renewals.

b) Training Fees

- i) Training fees are assessed monthly to active and provisional members, based on the number of dogs s/he is approved to train. Training fees are used to pay for the time and expertise of our world-class training helper. The fees allow participation in one open field obedience session (without instruction) and two protection sessions per TS per paid dog. A member may opt to split his protection sessions between two dogs, but only if the arrangement has met the prior approval of the training helper. A member may further request to exchange one of his/her protection sessions for an obedience session with instruction from the training director.
- ii) Paid training privileges do not extend to excessive email or phone contact with our helper/trainer. The respectful handler saves such questions to ask on TS.
- iii) Training fees must be submitted to a club officer on the first training Saturday of each month, **before** a member's first protection session. Our contract states that such fees must be paid whether all members are present or not. Members, who expect to be absent, must make prior arrangements with a WWDS member or officer to submit their fees for them. A late charge of \$25 is assessed in the event that a member has to be contacted by a club officer for failure to do so. This late fee will be forwarded to the WWDS member that generously covered the fees for the offending member. Repeated such instances may result in a membership review by the board of directors.
- iv) Fees may be paid in cash or by check made out to "Big Valley Dog Training" (or BVDT). Currently the fees are:
One dog (over 6 months old) - \$30 per TS
Two dogs - \$50 per TS
Three dogs - \$65 per TS
Each additional dog - add \$15 per TS
Puppies under 6 months of age - \$20 per TS
Puppies under 6 mo. as secondary dogs - Free

NOTE: Training fees are NON-refundable and missed sessions cannot be made up at a later date or traded.

c) Assessments

In case the number of active members and dogs does not yield the minimum fee owed to our training helper, a fee assessment will be added to each member's monthly fee to cover the difference. Assessments will be announced prior to each month's first TS.

d) Ice Chest Fees

Ice chest fees are assessed monthly and must be paid on the first TS of each month. Absent members must make prior arrangements through another WWDS member to submit their ice chest fees for them. The fee covers the purchase of ice, water and other drinks for our helpers, as well as one beverage per TS for each active member. The fee also covers the purchase of lunches for our training helpers. Fees may be paid in cash or by check made out to "Wild West Dogsport" (or WWDS). **Currently the fee is \$5 per active member per month.**

e) Drop-In Fees

Fees must be paid to the Sergeant at Arms in full **before** drop-ins can be added to the training line-up and begin training their dogs.

- The fee for active members wishing to work an extra dog in obedience is \$5 per dog per TS.
- The fee for active members wishing to work an extra dog in obedience & protection is \$35 per dog per TS.

- The fee for active members wishing to add a third run-through for a dog already in active training is \$15 (same dog).
- The visitor or inactive member drop-in fee for obedience & protection is \$45 per dog per TS (two protection sessions).
- The visitor or inactive member drop-in fee for obedience & protection (one protection session) is \$30 per dog per TS.
- The visitor or inactive member drop-in fee for obedience only is \$10 per dog per TS.
- A single-session dog evaluation fee is \$20 per dog (one time).

f) Fines

Penalty fines are assessed as follows and/or may be based on a board recommendation:

- Dog fouling the field training area - \$5 per incident, payable to the sergeant at arms.
- Dog eliminating onto any equipment - Minimum of \$35 per incident, or more based on the affected item and the board's discretion.

Fines may be escalated for repeat offenders, at the board's discretion. Other fines may be assessed at the board's discretion.

g) Scorebooks

Official DVG scorebooks may be obtained by submitting a scorebook application and fee to the club secretary. The current scorebook fee is \$18, made payable to "DVG America". Fee subject to change. **Allow approximately six (6) weeks to receive scorebooks from Germany.**

h) Fee Changes

- I. Training fees are set by agreement with our training helper. The agreed upon fee must be paid each month. If fees change, it may result in a change to each member's monthly fees. Such changes will be published in advance of the first month they are applicable to.
- II. Supplemental (ice chest) fees may be changed at any time if they are no longer sufficient in paying for the items they are intended for, as shown in Section 16d.
- III. Fee changes are decided upon by the board of directors. The emphasis will always be on maximizing member participation while retaining the most experienced and beneficial training helper.

18) Setup & Cleanup Duties

Each TS, one of the groups is in charge of the setup & cleanup of the field and training grounds. The following is a list of duties:

a) Setup:

- Retrieve wall & jump from storage area and stage them on the training field.
- Retrieve & place 6 blinds in proper positions on the field.
- Provide an ice chest with a sufficient amount of ice, bottled water, sports drinks and Pepsi (no other varieties). Care must be taken to purchase beverages when on sale; receipts are required for reimbursement from the ice chest fund.
- Carry sleeves, scratch pants and other equipment from the helper's vehicle to the training area.
- Place a trash can at the back corner of the sandbox area.

b) Cleanup:

- Return wall and jump to storage area; cover wall with protective tarp and tie down
- Take down, roll up and store 6 blinds
- Pass remaining beverages on to the next setup group
- Return training equipment to helper's vehicle
- Check grounds for items and trash left behind
- Check potty area for dog waste and remove

- Empty trash can into trash bin behind school buildings and return to its original position
- Clean up dog hair, muddy footprints or trash left in bathroom
- Turn off bathroom lights

19) Sergeant-in-Arms

The Sergeant-in-Arms shall have the following responsibilities and may delegate such responsibilities as necessary:

- a) Maintain order throughout all club meetings and assemblies
- b) Determine setup/cleanup group members and rotation
- c) Publish the upcoming month's training schedule and send via email to all members
- d) Maintain the training order during protection training and if necessary get the on-deck dog/handler team ready
- e) Collect the monthly supplemental fees and give to treasurer
- f) Collect fees for drop-ins, extra obedience turns, field fines etc. and deposit funds with treasurer
- g) Initiate lunch orders & designate a member for their retrieval
- h) Keep and maintain all property entrusted to the Sergeant-at-Arms for the term of office

20) Club Trials

- a) WWDS typically hosts two club trials per year and may also apply to host regional or national level trials. The two club trials are held in the spring and fall of each year.
- b) Club members are generally expected to attempt their first title within 2 years of joining the club or starting a new dog.
- c) Club members are expected to support each club trial in two ways – by participating in the preparation for and execution of the trial, as well as by entering the trial with their own dogs. Being entered in the trial **does not** preclude a member's involvement in supporting its preparation and execution. Rather, members entered should choose to help with tasks that are not likely to interfere with their trial participation. In addition, members can support club trials by repeating titles or acquiring tracking, obedience or other titles when their dogs are not ready for the full SchH title.
- d) Club members are expected to show their respect to trial judges by attending each day of judging, attending the judge's dinner, as well as by dressing smartly for competition, whether exhibiting in a club trial or a national competition.
- e) Club members are expected to do whatever possible to make visiting competitors feel welcome and comfortable, so as to promote repeat participation in future trials and events.
- f) Club members wishing to trial bitches in season are expected to follow all pertaining trial rules as well as being courteous and conscientious of negatively affecting a fellow competitor's performance. This also applies to members bringing non-entered bitches to the field within the week prior to the trial, although such action is strongly discouraged. Members should be courteous in the choice of parking spots both during tracking and during the trial and in abstaining from walking the bitch onto the trial or tracking fields except as required by the judge on the day of. Similar courtesies should be shown by members with dogs that exhibit excessive barking or may otherwise disturb competitors.
- g) A club trial constitutes a paid TS to our helper. Thus, dogs not entered in protection during the trial may have the opportunity for one (1) protection session after the trial concludes.

21) Complaints & Grievances

- a) WWDS members who observe violations of the standing rules should report this to a club officer. Any other complaints

must be made in writing and submitted to a member of the board of directors.

- b) Complaints must **never** be submitted to the Training Director/Training Helper directly.
- c) The board will review the complaint, request information and/or statements from the complainant and other sources and issue an official position within 14 days of receipt.
- d) The board may make one or more of the following recommendations based on their review:
 - To issue a warning to the offending member that will be considered should the same member receive future complaints
 - To issue a warning and/or assess a fine for the offense
 - To initiate a change in the standing rules to prevent future occurrences of the problem
 - To expel the member from WWDS club without refunds
 - To report the offense to DVG
 - To dismiss the charges

22) Revisions to Standing Rules

Standing rules are expected to change periodically based on the involvement of the club. With the exception of changes in training fees, fines and dues, all other changes to the standing rules shall be put to vote of the active membership.

The number of votes for each active member is directly related to the rounded average number of dogs the member is actively paying training fees for in the 6 months prior to the voting date. For example, if a member trained one dog in January and February and two dogs in March through June, s/he would have a voting number of 2 in a July vote (10 dogs/6 months = 1.67 – rounded to 2)
